Methodology

The information presented in this report was gathered from student self-reported data collected using the following methods: the online post-graduation destination survey administered by the College's Career Services in May, National Student Clearinghouse for subsequent education tracking, and Internet sources such as LinkedIn. It also includes information verified by employers and academic departments.

This data represents the initial destination after graduation and has not been updated for previous years. For example, the Class of 2016 data was current as of December 2016 and has not been updated since then.

Definitions

- Knowledge rate: the percent of graduates for which we have reasonable and verifiable information concerning the graduates' postgraduation career activities
- Employment: working full-time or part-time in an organization, fellowship, military, self-employed or freelance
- Continuing Education: accepted or attending additional academic opportunities

Results

Types of employment received by Ursuline graduates: full-time and part-time positions in the medical field, education, private businesses, government, and not-for-profit organizations.

Types of continuing/professional education pursued by Ursuline graduates: certificate program, internship, professional licensure, master's, law degree and doctorate programs in various fields including counseling and art therapy, business, historic preservation, library science, medicine, nursing, and theology.
