

Counseling and Art Therapy Scholarship Sarah Scherer Memorial Fund Fall 2024

Applications will be collected during the fall 2024 semester for spring or summer 2025 placement.

This scholarship was established in honor of Sarah Scherer, a student who died in a tragic accident while on vacation in Italy in the fall of 2007. Sarah was completing an internship at Signature Health, a community mental health agency where she also worked. Sarah's creativity, compassion, and wisdom were an inspiration to both her clients and fellow students. The recipient will receive a \$2,000.00 scholarship and complete a paid internship at Signature Health.

To be considered for this scholarship students must:

- Be enrolled as a regular student in the Counseling and Art Therapy Program
- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA). A FASFA is required to be on file in the financial aid office to provide information related to financial need.
- Submit the Sarah Scherer Scholarship Application form and attending documents. **Applications due by Monday, September 30, 2024, 5:00 p.m.** Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Please Note: Student will have completed CAT 546 Clinical Orientation I, CAT 547 Clinical Orientation II, CAT 519/519S Psychopathology and Diagnoses/Seminar, and CAT 520 Assessment by the time the placement begins in spring or summer 2025.

Grade point average and performance in previous clinical and internship placements will be taken into consideration when awarding this scholarship.

Applications will be reviewed by the Counseling and Art Therapy Department Clinical Director and Program Director, with input solicited from other faculty members and clinical or internship supervisors, if applicable. Selected candidates will then be recommended for interviews with personnel from Signature Health.

The final recipient will be determined by consensus with Signature Health personnel, the Counseling and Art Therapy Program Director and the Clinical Director.

The intern will begin in Spring or Summer 2025. The chosen applicant will receive a \$2,000 award as well as a paid internship and **must commit to a year of service. The scholarship is only awarded one time per year.
