An Adult–Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner provides care to adults, including older adults, both in the hospital and in clinics, provides complex monitoring, orders and interprets diagnostic tests and develops complex treatment plans based on current evidence–based practice to stabilize each patient and maximize their overall health. The emphasis is on the management of current and ongoing problems to prevent complications.
